Highland Park Central Elementary School did not make Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) in reading and has been put “on improvement.” Because Highland Park Central is “on improvement,” you may choose to continue sending your student to Highland Park Central or you may choose to send your student to a school that is not on improvement and has made AYP. The schools you may choose are Avondale East or Stout. The district will provide transportation to your school of choice as long as funds are available.

Below are two charts. The first chart shows student enrollment information for Highland Park Central and for the schools open for you to transfer your student because Highland Park Central is on improvement. The second chart shows the scores for each school on the Kansas Reading Assessment and the Kansas Math Assessment.

You may wish to visit the schools and ask questions about their reading and math programs as well as other subjects. **Please remember that you complete a transfer form and return it to Aaron Kipp’s office before the first day of school (August 17, 2011).**
