Who is eligible for Parents as Teachers?

Residents of the USD#501 school district that are pregnant or parenting a child birth to age three.



Is the program targeted to one special audience?

No, the program is for all families with young children regardless of income. Single parents, two parent families, grandparents, foster parents, first time parents as well as experienced parents can benefit from the developmental information and ideas.

Services

Personal visits -- during which your parent educator will share age-appropriate child development and parenting information, help you learn to observe your child, and address your parenting concerns. **Parent group meetings** -- which are opportunities to share information about parenting issues and child development. Parents learn and support each other, observe their children with other children and practice parenting skills.



Playgroups—during weekly playgroups, children have the opportunity to play with other children as their parents model play and interact with other parents.

Screenings -- to assess your child's overall development as well as health, hearing and vision.

Resource network -- that links your family to other community services

Transportation

Transportation is not provided for this program.

Fees

Parents as Teachers programs and services are provided to families free of charge. Parents as Teachers is funded by grants, community partnerships, Topeka Public Schools and the Kansas State Department of Education.

Times

Personalized home visits are offered during the day, evening and on weekends. A variety of playgroups are offered for families with children birth to age 5.
